She is no stranger to cancer, having walked the journey with several of her friends who have experienced breast cancer in recent years. She has not only been a supporter and caretaker for her friends, but also has faced cancer in an even more personal way, losing both of her parents to the disease.

Mamie is the former Assistant Administrator for Civil Rights for the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). In that capacity, she was the principal advisor to the Administrator on Civil Rights, equal employment opportunity, diversity, and affirmative action. She served as the FAA Diversity Advocate and led the agency's efforts to create a positive environment that supports and encourages the contributions of all employees. She also managed Agency efforts to ensure the elimination of unlawful discrimination in federally-operated and-assisted FAA transportation programs at airports. Before joining the Office of Civil Rights, and throughout her career, Mamie has many years of experience serving as an advocate for Civil Rights and Diversity. She has committed herself to ensure accessibility, opportunity, and advancement for all.
